There should be nothing controversial about this legislation – PBEM applies for the UASI grant every year since 2003 to enhance emergency preparedness by planning, training and equipping emergency responders in the five county urban area.

 - 1. The Department of Homeland Security has designated Portland as the core member of the Urban Area Security Initiative region.
 - 2. All funds received through UASI are disbursed through a rigorous process that includes several jurisdictions and disciplines in the public safety, emergency management, and public health and public works.
 - 3. This grant is applied for, and awarded, every year back to 2003, except for 2012 when the federal terrorism risk for this region was ranked below the funding threshold for that year.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Department of Homeland Security provides financial assistance to selected urban areas through the FY 2014 Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI). The city of Portland, in cooperation with regional partners (TriMet, Port of Portland, Multnomah, Clackamas, Washington and Columbia counties of Oregon and Clark County, Washington) is applying for financial assistance to address the unique equipment, training, planning, exercise and operational needs of large urban areas.
- 2. The Department of Homeland Security has designated Portland, Oregon as the core urban area in the State of Oregon.
- 3. The City of Portland has applied for and received Homeland Security UASI grant funds since FY2003 and has worked with regional partners to coordinate, plan and procure equipment to respond to disasters, terrorism, and hazards. No match is required by this grant.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor through the Bureau of Emergency Management is hereby authorized to make application to the Department of Homeland Security for a grant in the amount of \$902,500.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists to meet grant submittal deadlines. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
