The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program provides financial and technical assistance through their Fiscal Year 2014 grant for the development of an all hazard emergency management capability to promote planning, response, exercise, training and community outreach.
- 2. Grant funds are budgeted for one half of the cost of three Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) positions, one half of the annual rent for PBEM office space, one half the cost of Technology Services for the Emergency Coordination Center/PBEM, and one half of the Public Alert Hosting contract cost. All funds received through the EMPG program will be provided on a reimbursable basis and will be matched in the amount of \$385,027 in the form of salary, benefits, and materials and services in the FY 2014-15 budget of the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and Portland Bureau of Emergency Management are hereby authorized to make application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Emergency Management Performance Grant program for a grant in the amount of \$ 385,027.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because grant is due on June 13, 2014. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
