a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

This Resolution adopts the *Foster Road Transportation and Streetscape Plan* as Non-Binding City Policy. It contains a series of Action Items that will be developed into projects as part of future budgeting processes. The Action Items focus on increasing multi-modal access along Foster Road from SE 52nd Ave to Lents Town Center, with an emphasis on providing safer intersection crossings and bicycle facilities.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

A Stakeholder Advisory Committee was convened to guide development of the Plan. The Foster-Powell Neighborhood Association, Creston-Kenilworth Neighborhood Association, Mt. Scott-Arleta Neighborhood Association, Lents Neighborhood Association, Southeast Uplift, Portland Mercado, Foster Area Business Association, Foster Green EcoDistrict, Oregon Walks, Bicycle Transportation Alliance, ROSE CDC, Latino Network, OPAL, and other neighborhood and business representatives were active participants, in addition to the City's Bicycle Advisory Committee, Pedestrian Advisory Committee, Freight Advisory Committee and the Accessibility in the Built Environment Subcommittee of the Portland Commission on Disability. Staff from City Bureaus, Metro, TriMet, and the Oregon Department of Transportation served as technical review staff throughout the process.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The Stakeholder Advisory Committee was directly involved in all aspects of the development of the plan and Action Items, from initial concept development to final recommendations. The project held 5 public open houses (attended by over 450 people) and provided an online and written survey where staff received feedback from the general public. In addition, staff attended several community meetings and met with many individuals and organizations to discuss the project.
