The vehicles will be purchased from a local dealer using the Oregon State Price Agreement. # 0434. The cost of the eighty (80) patrol vehicles will be \$2,332,375.68. The Portland Police Bureau has requested the Ford Interceptor Utility for the replacement of the patrol sedans. Many police agencies have selected the Ford Utility Interceptor because of the additional driver leg and head room. Additionally, the larger capacity at the back of the vehicle will allow the officers to store and transport more effectively and efficiently the necessary equipment needed to carry out their daily duties. The Ford Interceptor Utility is on the same platform as the Ford Interceptor Sedan. The Ford Utility has what is called in the industry a different "Top Hat." The vehicle resembles a crossover wagon as it sits a little taller and is all wheel drive. All wheel drive vehicles are becoming more popular throughout Police Forces as they provide better traction and maneuverability while driving. The vehicle has better visibility for officers to see traffic and allows the vehicle to be seen by other people in traffic, which improves officer safety.
