For the NE 52nd & Alberta St Local Improvement District the project will resolve transportation and storm water infrastructure deficiencies in the area in advance of a new park being constructed. Coordination of the planned street and park improvements minimizes disruption to nearby residents.

The construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State of Oregon as minority, women and emerging small businesses. - 7. <u>BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:</u> Ordinance Numbers 185190 & 185962 adopted March 7, 2012 & April 3, 2013 respectively, authorized a contract to provide for payment for the 2014 Local Improvement District Project.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimates for the construction portions of the projects were \$1,463,255.53 for NE 112th & Marx LID and \$205,602.82 for NE 52nd & Alberta St LID, and the confidence level was low for both. Funds are available in the Local Improvement District budget, SAP Owner Cost Objects T00347 and T00377.
