Formed in 2010, the PSC has specific responsibility for the stewardship, development and maintenance of the City's Comprehensive Plan, Climate Action Plan and Zoning Code. By holding public hearings and discussing issues and proposals, the PSC develops recommendations to share with City Council in hopes of creating a more prosperous, educated, healthy and equitable city.

Broadening the voice of members of the PSC will benefit all Portlanders. To continue to increase the diversity of the PSC, there is a new position filled by a younger community member. A youth perspective is especially important since today's youth will be those inheriting our efforts. Engaging youth on the PSC provides a new perspective and opinion on issues that will help shape the future of the city.
