### 7. <u>BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS</u>:

The City of Portland Bureau of Transportation, Parking Enforcement Division is responsible for enforcement of the City's parking code, which governs metered parking spaces, public and private parking lots and garages, as well as parking on City streets outside of metered areas. There are over 9,490 metered parking spaces.

Parking citations are issued both by Portland Parking enforcement officers and Abandoned Auto inspectors. Both enforcement officers and inspectors issue citations using all-in-one handheld units with cameras, and the handheld unit is the sole means by which citations are issued. The City's current handheld units are nearing the end of their service life and need to be replaced.

On December 10, 2012, the City issued RFP No. 113778 for a Parking Enforcement Handheld Citation System. On January 28, 2013 five responsive proposals were received and Schweers Technologies Inc. was the highest scoring proposer. The proposals were reviewed, evaluated, and scored by the evaluation committee in accordance with Portland City Code 5.33. The proposal from Schweers Technologies Inc. was deemed responsive to the requirements of the solicitation and received the highest evaluation scores. The City issued a Notice of Intent to Negotiate and Award a contract on April 19, 2013 from which no protests were received.

The City seeks to execute a contract with Schweers Technologies, Inc. for handheld parking enforcement hardware, software, and services in order to support the City's parking enforcement operations. Schweers Technologies, Inc. has a Portland business license tax account, is in compliance with the Equal Benefits Program, and their EEO Certification is current through July 25, 2015.

The Bureau's level of confidence in the cost estimates for this project is high, as there is very good historical information showing purchases made for this equipment.
