## ORDINANCE No. 186737

\* Authorize a grant agreement with Janus Youth Programs, Inc. for \$297,000 to provide shelter beds, treatment, and case management for juvenile human trafficking victims (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. At least 469 children were exploited as commercial sex workers in Portland between 2009 and 2013 according to a 2013 study by Portland State University.
- 2. The City of Portland and Multnomah County have joined together to fund shelter beds and treatment for juvenile human trafficking victims at a Janus Youth facility.
- 3. The Sexual Assault Resource Center (SARC) provides extensive support to human trafficking victims between the ages of 18 and 25 years old through a 24-hour crisis line, hospital visits, case management, prevention education and outreach, support groups, and free confidential advocacy services.
- 4. In order to continue to provide a safe place for human trafficking victims between the ages of 18 and 25, provide essential treatment services, and fund additional SARC victim advocates, the City agrees to provide \$152,000 to support Janus.
- 5. Janus Youth operates the Athena House which provides emergency and long-term stabilization through shelter beds and a safe place for commercially exploited youth between the ages of 14 and 17 years old.
- 6. In order to continue to provide a safe place for juvenile human trafficking victims, provide essential treatment services, and fund additional Athena House victim advocates, the City agrees to provide \$145,000 to support Janus.
- 7. The FY 2014-15 Budget includes funding of \$297,000 in the General Fund Special Appropriations to make a grant to Janus Youth Programs for these purposes.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Mayor and City Auditor are hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement with Janus Youth in an amount not to exceed \$297,000 substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would deprive the City and Janus Youth of the benefits of the agreement. This contract is time-sensitive to the fiscal year and as such cannot afford the longer processing time of a non-emergency ordinance.

Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
