# The Map App enables community members to review and comment on proposed projects.







#### **Bureau of Environmental Services**

- Current: \$12.5 billion in grey and green infrastructure to manage and treat sanitary sewer and stormwater
- Future: \$1.73 billion investment in:
  - Wastewater treatment
  - Collection system maintenance and reliability
  - Surface water management
  - System development







#### **Portland Water Bureau**

Current: \$5.5 billion of water infrastructure

Future: \$1.57 billion in investment in:

- Water supply
- Transmission and storage
- Distribution
- Treatment
- Compliance, customer service, and support







#### **Portland Bureau of Transportation**

- Current: \$5.5 billion of multi-modal transportation infrastructure
- Future: The Transportation System Plan (TSP) serves as the Transportation element of the Citywide Systems Plan and includes recommended projects. The TSP is being updated as part of the Comprehensive Plan Update. The current list includes roughly \$2.6 billion in candidate projects.







#### Portland Parks & Recreation

Current: \$1 billion of park and recreation infrastructure

Future: Desired improvements to:

- Maintain
- Improve parks, natural areas, trails,
- Develop recreation and maintenance facilities
- Acquire







#### Other Essential Facilities & Systems

Current: \$1.3 billion of infrastructure, including:

- Office, spectator, performing arts, PDC, and other facilities
- Communications, production, and strategic technology
- Fire, police, and other emergency response facilities
