# a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

This sewer construction project will replace or repair about 31,500 feet of public sewer pipes in the Sellwood-Moreland neighborhood that are between 80 and 100 years old and failing due to age. Replacing and repairing these public sewer pipes will help protect the public and the environment by reducing the possibility of costly breaks, leaks, blockages and sewage releases to homes, businesses and streets. The project area covers about 90 city blocks within the boundaries of Sellwood Park to the west, SE 25th Avenue to the east, SE Reedway Street to the north, SE Linn Street to the south, and the Waverley Country Club.

Construction on these 90 city blocks will include spot repairs on 15 blocks, cured-inplace-pipe lining (CIPP) on 30 blocks, and open excavation on 45 blocks. Among the residential and commercial properties fronting the construction, approximately 364 will have their public sewer service lateral replaced. The spot repairs and CIPP lining should create much less impact on the neighborhood than the open excavation.

Construction will create noise, vibration and dust and will disrupt normal neighborhood activity, CIPP lining produces a temporary odor; while unpleasant, it is not harmful to human health. Traffic control signs will be set up. The contractor will maintain local access, but delays should be expected. On-street parking in or near the work area will be prohibited during construction hours. Equipment and materials may be stored on nearby streets overnight.

For households directly fronting the work sites, there may be brief periods of sewer and water service interruption and brief periods of driveway access delay. If these interruptions are necessary, they will be carefully managed and residents will be notified in advance.

No extended impacts are anticipated for businesses or traffic along SE Milwaukie Avenue, SE 17th Avenue, or SE Bybee Boulevard. No impacts are anticipated for Sellwood Park, Westmoreland Park, or area schools.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State of Oregon as minority, women, and emerging small businesses. They became involved when the project advertised for bids on June 18, 2014.

- c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item? Bids received resulted in the award of the construction contract.
- d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

Procurement Services publically solicited the project as a competitive invitation to bid on the Online Procurement Center and managed the procurement process. A prebid meeting was held and was open to the construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State as minority, women, and emerging small businesses.

- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 186511 adopted March 26, 2014 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Sellwood-Moreland Sewer Rehabilitation. The Sellwood-Moreland Sewer Rehabilitation project involves the construction approximately 31,500 feet of combined and sanitary sewer pipe in the Sellwood-Moreland neighborhoods that are severely deteriorated and needs to be replaced.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this project was \$7,500,000.00 and the confidence level was High. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2014/2015 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS Element E10333.
- 9. **RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:** Accept Recommendation to award contract to Moore Excavation, Inc. in the amount of \$8,902,765.00.
- 10. <u>SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT:</u> The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary to replace or rehabilitate approximately 31,500 feet of combined and sanitary sewer pipe, inlets and manholes in the Sellwood-Moreland Neighborhood.
