7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Contract No. 30002669 for construction oversight services was executed in May 2012 in anticipation of a large scale renovation project for the Veterans Memorial Coliseum. The contract was let prior to completion of the redevelopment agreements so preliminary work could be done during the off season. The redevelopment agreements were not completed but the construction activities continued into 2014 and included replacement of the ice floor and plant, freight elevator modernization, back flow valve replacement and vault repairs, modification of sideline retractable seating platforms to match new ice floor dimensions, remediation of identified environmental contamination, and replacement of CFC refrigerants. To provide continued construction oversight for this work, the contract was amendment in March 2014 to add \$24,000 to the total compensation amount and to extend the expiration to December 2014.

Recently several additional work tasks have been identified that required prompt attention during the off season and prior to winter weather setting in; this work also requires ongoing construction oversight services. This work includes structural repair of a beam in the VMC Exhibit Hall and replacement of the waterproof lining in the above grade planter boxes in the Plaza. In addition, previously planned restriping work in the Rose Quarter parking facilities was expanded to include correction of certain ADA barriers, identified through the City's yet to be adopted Transition Plan, which were less costly to address in conjunction with the restriping work.

The scope and duration of the construction oversight needed for the planned Fiscal 2014-15 work, in addition to the continued work from Fiscal 2013-14, prompted the Office of Management and Finance to begin an Intermediate Request for Proposals solicitation and selection process. The

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process is expected to be completed in late-September or early-October 2014. In the interim, a second amendment to the existing contract is needed to provide uninterrupted construction oversight services in August and September.

The Ordinance authorizes the Chief Procurement Officer to execute a second amendment to Contract No. 30002669, which increases the total compensation by \$30,000. The additional compensation under this Ordinance, along with the additional compensation under Contract Amendment No. 1, totals \$54,000, which is 56% of the original compensation amount of \$96,000. The new not to exceed amount of Contract No. 30002669 is \$150,000.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

While the costs associated with this contract amendment were not specifically contemplated when the Fiscal Year 2014-15 budget was developed, sufficient funds reside within the Spectator Facilities Fund to cover the increased compensation authorized under this Ordinance.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

The CAO recommends that Council adopt the Ordinance authorizing an increase of \$30,000 to the total compensation under Contract No. 30002669.
