4) Revenue: Will this legislation generate or reduce current or future revenue coming to the City? If so, by how much? If so, please identify the source.

The 83 approved Homebuyer Opportunity Limited Tax Exemption applications will increase revenue for the City of Portland in the form of a one-time application fee totaling \$132,800. A total of \$1600 is collected for each completed and approved application, \$750 goes towards Portland Housing Bureau administrative costs and \$850 is paid to Multnomah County for administrative costs.

Portland Housing Bureau retains a portion of the administrative costs collected for each application denied (9 total), equaling \$375 each for a total of \$3375. The denied tax exemptions do not affect foregone revenue aside from there being no additional foregone revenue compared

to if the applications were approved.

Additionally, for each unit being terminated under the HOLTE program (18), approximately \$1,831 will be added annually to the tax rolls for a total of \$32,958. For each unit being terminated under the TOD program, (1), approximately \$844 will be added annually to the tax rolls.

This legislation will decrease revenue for the City of Portland in the form of forgone revenue. The 83 approved HOLTE exemptions represent an estimated average of \$1,831 in foregone property taxes per year for each unit, for total annual forgone revenue of \$132,800 and \$1,328,000 over the total life of the ten year tax exemption. These dollar amounts include taxes foregone by the City of Portland, Multnomah County and other entities which receive property taxes within Multnomah County.
