a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

This ordinance authorizes contracts with Brown and Caldwell, Kennedy/Jenks Consultants, and Murray, Smith & Associates, Inc., for professional engineering services for the Sewer System Rehabilitation Engineering Services 2014 Project (Projects No. E10031, E10500, and E10576). The sewer rehabilitation projects that develop out of this design work will be located in many different parts of the city. Anticipated impacts from these projects will include lane closures, temporary removal of on-street parking, construction materials stored in the public right of way, daytime construction noise, etc.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

BES Communications staff have been working with community leaders in the future project areas for the past few years as a result of previous sewer and stormwater projects. Through these discussions, BES project staff have received input on specific construction related concerns in various Portland neighborhoods. Once specific projects are in design, and timelines are better understood, public involvement staff will engage business owners, property owners, stakeholder associations, and interested parties through direct mail, presentations at association meetings, project websites, etc.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

As each project design gets underway, public involvement staff will engage the public in the affected neighborhoods to better understand how construction impacts can be mitigated. These efforts will result in a public outreach plan that will continue throughout design and construction.

BES Communications Division staff will oversee the design and implementation of public involvement efforts by the public involvement consultants for the projects that develop out of this engineering design services contract.

10) Is any future public involvement anticipated or necessary for this Council item? Please describe why or why not.

Yes, future public involvement work is necessary and is included in the scope of work for these contracts. The contracts that are authorized via this Ordinance represent scoping, final design, and design services during construction for these sewer infrastructure projects. For each assigned project, project staff will need to work closely with residents, business owners, and community leaders to ensure that the project, construction impacts, and opportunities for mitigation are well understood and addressed.
