7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

On August 8, 2011 a vehicle driven by Cleon Harris was rear-ended by a Portland Fire Bureau driver on NE 122nd Avenue and NE Sandy. Mr. Harris sustained injuries from this incident and began chiropractic treatment the following day. Mr. Harris was subsequently rear-ended by another driver on December 8, 2011, and sustained additional injuries and continued with his medical treatment. Mr. Harris was involved in a third motor vehicle accident in June 2012, this time it was he who rear-ended another vehicle. Mr. Harris eventually underwent back surgery in September 2012. In July 2013, Mr. Harris' attorney filed a lawsuit against the City and the driver of the vehicle in the December 2011 accident, seeking more than \$67,000 in medical expenses and \$250,000 in non-economic damages.

This is an admitted liability case where the only issue is the apportionment between the two defendants for the cause of injury and treatment, the need for surgery, and the costs associated with them. Plaintiff and City defendant each retained their own medical experts who would offer differing testimony at trial about the causation issue, but all experts would agree the City likely was at least 50% responsible. With an early August 2014 trial date approaching, the parties began exploring the possibility of settlement, and an agreement has been reached. Risk

Management Services and the City Attorney's Office have proposed the City pay \$75,000 to Mr. Harris and his attorney, while the other defendant's insurance company has agreed to pay considerably more. The City has already paid Mr. Harris' insurance company \$3,685.10 to reimburse for medical expenses paid under the auto policy. Combined with the \$75,000 proposed for Mr. Harris, the total city cost of resolving this injury claim is \$78,685.10.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$75,000 from the liability fund. Added to the \$3,685.10 payment previously made to Wawanesa Insurance, the total cost of the injury claim for Mr. Harris is \$78,685.10

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Cleon Harris bodily injury lawsuit in the sum of \$75,000. Added to the \$3,685.10 payment previously made to Wawanesa Insurance, the total cost of the injury claim for Mr. Harris is \$78,685.10.
