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7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Over the course of his 24 years of employment, Mr. Leben filed multiple Workers' Compensation claims for numerous medical conditions. Mr. Leben has received all benefits due for accepted conditions. These benefits include medical services, disability payments and modified duty work under HRAR 7.08. The City determined that several of the most recent claimed conditions were not compensable under the Oregon workers' compensation rules and denied the claims, which became the subject of litigation. An Administrative Law Judge ordered the City to accept several claims, while some were found not to be work-related. The City has appealed the Administrative Law Judge's order to the Oregon Workers' Compensation Board.

In order to avoid future litigation the parties have reached a proposed settlement, agreeable to the injured worker, his attorney, the bureau, City Attorney and Risk Management.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$82,500 from the Workers' Compensation fund and \$500 from the Bureau of Transportation.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Steven Leben Bodily Injury Claims in the sum of \$83,000.
