1) Legislation Title:

Authorize an Agreement with Clark Regional Emergency Services Agency for the installation and co-location of radio equipment in the amount of \$29,335 and provide funding for site improvements in the amount of \$16,000 (Ordinance)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

Clark Regional Emergency Services Agency (CRESA) has the legal right of possession of approximately 2,500 square feet of space situated on the property commonly known as Prune Hill in Clark County, Washington. CRESA operates a mobile radio service facility at this location.

The Water Bureau operates and maintains Data Radio Equipment for Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) communications at the Prune Hill Location. This radio equipment is essential for bureau monitoring and control of critical facilities throughout the Portland metropolitan area.

The bureau had the ability to enter into an agreement with CRESA to utilize a portion of the CRESA's telecommunications site for the installation and co-location of radio equipment. This location provides secured space, utility and emergency power, climate control for Water Bureau radio equipment, and allows access to the facility twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. The Co-Location Agreement grants the bureau the right to install, maintain, and operate at its own expense a telecommunication facility.

The Water Bureau will also pay for CRESA to hire an engineering firm to determine whether any structural improvement to the existing tower on the property will be required in order to attach bureau equipment. Upon completion of the review, CRESA will provide the findings to the bureau. The bureau will determine whether the improvement identified from the study are necessary and whether a long term agreement with CRESA is beneficial to both parties.

The total not to exceed amount of the Co-Location Agreement is \$5,335 for the first year. The total cost for subsequent years may fluctuate per fiscal year. The current estimate per fiscal year is \$6,000. The Co-Location Agreement will not exceed \$29,335 for the five year term of the agreement.

If the CRESA report findings indicate that conditions warrant that a future master radio upgrade must be installed by the Water Bureau within the next five years, the Bureau will provide Council with a report recommending the acceptance of the structural improvement for a cost not to exceed \$16,000. Funding for any future master radio upgrades will be requested in the appropriate Fiscal Year Budget.
