7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This ordinance authorizes a contract with a construction project management consultant for cost estimation services and construction project management services at the Veterans Memorial Coliseum (VMC) and other City-owned Rose Quarter properties. The contract requires Council approval because it exceeds \$100,000.

Previous work on reuse and renovation of the VMC was completed in 2012 but did not move to implementation. OMF has initiated the VMC Options Study to build upon prior efforts and examine several renovation scenarios and options to continue under the current operating conditions, close the facility or consider the potential redevelopment of the site. The contract authorized by this Ordinance includes the cost estimation services needed for the VMC Options Study.

The contract also includes ongoing construction project management services for work at the VMC and other City-owned Rose Quarter properties, including ADA Transition Plan implementation efforts at the parking garages and capital improvements to the above grade planter boxes in the plaza.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

This legislation will result in a one-time expenditure of \$125,165, which is in the FY 2014-15 Spectator Facilities budget, and will not generate or reduce current or future revenue to the City.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

The CAO recommends that Council authorize this contract.
