1) Legislation Title:

Amend City Code Sections 21.36.010-21.36.040 to include the U.S. Department of Interior Bureau of Land Management as a managing partner, update enforcement provisions, and adopt an updated map of the Bull Run Watershed Closure Area (Ordinance; amend Code Sections 21.36.010, 21.36.020, 21.36.030, 21.36.040)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The purpose of this action is to provide administrative updates to City Code Sections 21.36.010, 21.36.020, 21.36.030, and 21.36.040 concerning protections for the Bull Run watershed. The proposed action will add the U.S. Department of Interior Bureau of Land Management (BLM) as a managing partner of the Bull Run Watershed Management Unit (BRWMU) along with Water Bureau and the U.S. Forest Service (Forest Service), update enforcement provisions to be consistent with the authorities granted under both Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) and City Code, and adopt an updated map of the Bull Run Watershed Closure Area (Closure Area) that includes BLM lands that are now formally closed to public access.

In February 2010, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 183540 that established the boundaries of the Closure Area, including City and Forest Service lands. The land belonging to the BLM within the BRWMU was not included in the Closure Area because it had not yet formally closed its lands to public entry. In 2011, BLM adopted an administrative order in relation to the Closure Area that formally closed its Bull Run lands to public entry. A 2013 Intergovernmental Agreement between the City and BLM now grants the City shared enforcement authority with BLM on BLM lands in the Closure Area.

Ordinance No. 183540 was passed by the Portland City Council in 2010 pursuant to the authority granted in ORS 448.295 to ORS 448.325. At the time, the penalty for violation listed in ORS 448.305 (3) was an unclassified misdemeanor, which carried with it a \$100 fine and or up to 30 days in jail. The penalty for violation of an ordinance passed pursuant to the authority granted in ORS 448.295-448.325 was changed in 2011 by the Oregon State Legislature from an unclassified misdemeanor to a Class C misdemeanor. A Class C misdemeanor carries with it a \$1250 fine and or up to 30 days in jail. The 2010 City Code was written to explicitly list the \$100 fine and 30 days in jail associated with an unclassified misdemeanor. This proposed City code change aligns

the City Code with the updated penalty listed under ORS 448.305 (3) and keeps the City Code consistent with the ORS into the future.

Additionally, the code is amended to provide the Water Bureau Administrator authority to pursue enforcement of any violations of City Code Sections 21.36.020 or 21.36.030 pursuant to the authority found in City Code Section 21.24.090. This code change enables the Water Bureau Administrator to levy a civil fine for violations of the aforementioned City Code sections and is one more tool designed to keep the watershed safe from unauthorized entry.

City Code Section 21.36.040 is also amended to correctly assign court jurisdiction for enforcement actions to the county in which the violation occurs. The code previously named only Multnomah County, but is now amended to include Clackamas and Hood River Counties, both of which include part of the BRWMU.
