* Authorize application to the Rockefeller Foundation for a grant in the amount of \$1,000,000 to develop and implement a citywide resilience plan, become an integrated member of the 100 Resilient Cities Network, and create a Chief Resilience Officer within City government. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The majority of people on the planet now live in cities, creating new vulnerabilities to health and economic well-being, as well as greater pressures for urban planning and governance.
- 2. To enable cities to build resilience in the face of increasing social, economic, and physical challenges, and to capitalize on the opportunity and innovation that occurs in cities, the Rockefeller Foundation has launched the 100 Resilient Cities Centennial Challenge. The program provides technical support and resources for developing and implementing plans for urban resilience.
- 3. If selected, the City would receive technical and financial support to to hire a Chief Resilience Officer and develop a citywide resilience strategy. The City would also become a participating member of the 100 Resilient Cities Network.
- 4. The Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM), in collaboration with the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability (BPS) would like to apply for a grant from this program.
- 5. No match is required by this grant.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the Rockefeller Foundation for a grant in a. the amount of \$1,000,000.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the c. grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in the application for this grant could result in losing the opportunity for funding. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
