RE: Amendment request for Council Agenda Item 959

Amend ordinance to modify the conditions of approval and revise the legal description for the vacation of a portion of SW 46th Ave and a portion of SW Florida St subject to certain conditions and reservations (Ordinance; amend Ordinance 185174; VAC-10070)

At the City Council meeting on September 17, 2014, Commissioner Amanda Fritz proposed an amendment to Section c.2. of the above referenced Agenda Item No. 959. That amendment will need to be withdrawn on the October 15, 2014 Council meeting. The following amended language should replace Section c.2. of said Agenda Item.

2. That the petitioner will dedicate a 15 foot wide strip of public right-of-way along the southerly most portion of their property, west of SW 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue, to be improved as a sidewalk or recreational trail. at such time in the future that a through pedestrian connection to SW 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue is established. Said dedication will be In order to satisfy this condition, the petitioner will sign said dedication in substantially the same form as Exhibit B attached hereto and will provide a signed Waiver of Remonstrance towards the future pedestrian improvements within said dedication area. Said dedication and said waiver will be recorded concurrently and delivered with this street vacation ordinance.

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- b. That Ordinance No. 185174, Section 1.b, "Conditions and Reservations" of the Council directives are hereby revised as follows:
  - 1. Directive b3 is hereby repealed.
  - 2. Directive b4 is hereby repealed
  - 3. Directive b7 is hereby repealed.
  - 4. Directive b8 is hereby repealed.

- c. That vacation of the above-described street area is granted subject to the following new conditions and reservations:
  - That the petitioner will construct sidewalks and other pedestrian zone improvements along the west side of SW 45<sup>th</sup> Avenue between SW Vermont and SW California Streets, along the south side of SW Vermont Street west of SW 45<sup>th</sup> Avenue, and along SW California Street between SW 45<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The width and length of the sidewalk improvements will be determined once preliminary survey and engineering work is complete. These improvements will be constructed through the City's LID.
  - 2. That the petitioner will dedicate a 15 foot wide strip of public right-of-way along the southerly most portion of their property, west of SW 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue, to be improved as a sidewalk or recreational trail at such time in the future that a through pedestrian connection to SW 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue is established. Said dedication will be in substantially the same form as Exhibit B attached hereto. Said dedication will be recorded concurrently and delivered with this street vacation ordinance.
  - 3. That the petitioner will dedicate additional public right-of-way as needed for construction of a cul-de-sac at the west end of SW California Street where it intersects with SW 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue, the amount to be determined by the City Engineer with improvements being constructed as part of the LID.
  - 4. That the petitioner will grant a Sewer Easement to the City and execute said document in substantially the same form as Exhibit C attached hereto for facilities owned and maintained by the Bureau of Environmental Services within the portion of SW 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue to be vacated. Said easement will be recorded concurrently and delivered with this street vacation Ordinance.
- d. All other terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 185174 shall remain unchanged and all conditions thereof shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 2. Petitioner shall file with the City Auditor, in form approved by the City Attorney, a document in writing, accepting the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.

#### 9) If "YES," please answer the following questions:

# a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

Council passage of this Ordinance will support the construction of a series of improved sidewalks, stormwater treatment facilities, and the planting of street trees along SW 45<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW California Street. There will be a loss of a gravel parking strip along a portion of SW 45<sup>th</sup> Avenue, however increased visibility will result in improved safety in this area.

#### b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

Outreach has been made by PBOT staff and by representatives of St. Luke Church to owners of property abutting the planned improvements, SWNI, the Maplewood Neighborhood Association, SW Trails PDX, the Pedestrian Advisory Committee, Oregon Walks, and the Bicycle Transportation Alliance.

#### c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Citizen requests for enhanced pedestrian connections are now being advanced through the dedication of a new 15 foot wide public right-of-way located west of the intersection of SW California Street and SW 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

## d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

Representatives from St. Luke Church have worked with the Maplewood Neighborhood Association and with nearby property owners to share their development plans and to revise a plan for addressing concerns about bike and pedestrian accessibility in the area. LID Project Manager Andrew Aebi has met with the adjacent property owners to refine the list of transportation improvements to be funded through the LID process. PBOT staff met with Don Baack and Glenn Bridger from SW Trails PDX to brief them on the amended street vacation conditions and to explore other options for addressing pedestrian access in the area.
