7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) is responsible for providing Portland residents with water quality protection, watershed planning, wastewater collection and treatment, sewer installation and stormwater management. More than one-third of the City's 2,500 miles of sewer pipes are over 80 years old and projects are underway to replace or repair aging sewers.

Ordinance Number 186559 adopted May 7, 2014 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Price Agreement for Urgent Rehabilitation of Sanitary and Storm Sewers with an initial contract term of one year, renewable up to an additional two years for a total duration not to exceed three years. The purpose of this price agreement is to complete sanitary and storm system rehabilitation work requiring urgent attention through issuance of work orders.

8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this price agreement was \$3,000,000 for a one-year term and the confidence level was high. The total

- expenditure will be a not to exceed \$9,000,000 for a three-year term. Funds are available in the FY 2014 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services.
- **9.** RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED: Accept Recommendation to award a price agreement to James W. Fowler Co. in the amount of \$3,000,000 for a one year period renewable up to two additional years for a total not to exceed amount of \$9,000,000.
- 10.
