# ORDINANCE No. 186861

\*Authorize revenue-generating Revegetation Sponsorship Agreement in the amount of \$144,093 with Colwood Industrial Park, LLC for vegetation management services at Colwood Golf Course Mitigation site. (Ordinance)

## The City of Portland ordains:

#### Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. As a result of permits associated with the forthcoming industrial development, Colwood Industrial Park, LLC is required to implement habitat restoration and enhancement work on over 20 acres of natural area at the Colwood site, on both City property and private property.
- 2. The City of Portland Bureau of Environmental Services Watershed Revegetation Program is a regional expert in native vegetation management and habitat restoration in the Columbia Slough watershed.
- 3. It is in the best interest of both parties for the City of Portland Bureau of Environmental Services Watershed Revegetation Program to perform the required work.
- 4. This agreement allows Colwood Industrial Park, LLC (a subsidiary of Trammell Crow Company) to reimburse the Watershed Revegetation Program for all costs to install and maintain a portion of the required mitigation plantings for 5 years.
- 5. This agreement requires the City to hold Colwood Industrial Park, LLC harmless from negligence or intentional misconduct of the City's contracted work crews except to the extent that such claims arise from the negligence or intentional misconduct of Colwood Industrial Park, LLC.
- 6. The estimated cost is \$144,093. Funds from Colwood Industrial Park, LLC will reimburse BES vegetation management costs. Receiving cost object is ESEN000023.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner in Charge is authorized to execute an agreement with Colwood Industrial Park, LLC, for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of \$144,093, and to execute any amendments thereto.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because of the time sensitive nature of vegetation management work. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
