- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 186758 adopted August 13, 2014 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the SW Ventilation & Capacity Improvements Project. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) has a need to construct the SW Ventilation & Capacity Improvements project to provide odor treatment and increased sewer conveyance capacity.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT</u>: The engineer's estimate for this project was \$2,700,000.00 and the confidence level was Optimal. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2015 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS Element E10121.C14.
- 9. <u>**RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:**</u> Accept Recommendation to award contract to Moore Excavation, Inc. in the amount of \$3,458,479.00.
- 10. <u>SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT</u>: This project involves the construction of the Taylors Ferry Ventilation Facility (TFVF) upgrade and new construction of combined sewer along SW Virginia Avenue and Taylors Ferry Road.
