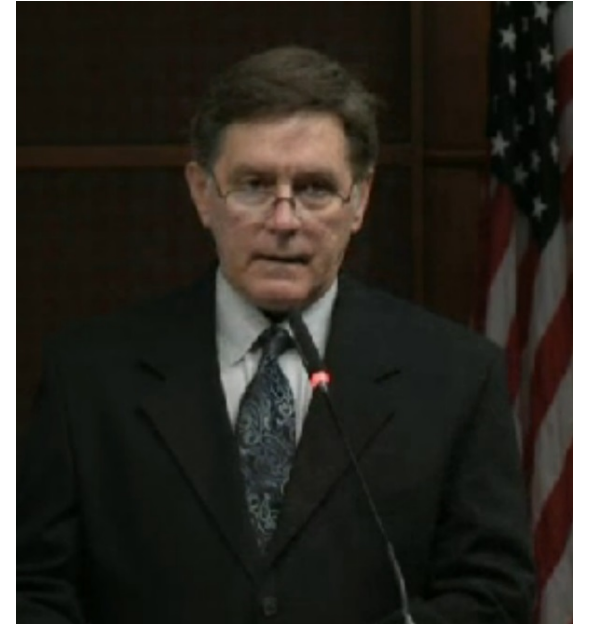
Dennis Rosenbaum
