### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This ordinance settles the state circuit court lawsuit brought by the Estate of Gregory Haase v. City of Portland et al. The plaintiff's case concerns a scooter crash. Plaintiff alleges that the public right of way under the SW Naito viaduct was unsafe and lacked adequate street lighting making the City liable for damages. On September 5, 2012 Mr. Haase drove over a depressed phone company manhole and lost control striking a bridge abutment. In a mediation with Judge Sid Brockley the parties and city representatives agreed to settle the case prior to trial for \$125,000 pending City Council approval.

### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$125,000 from the liability fund.

### 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of the Estate of Gregory Haase lawsuit in the sum of \$125,000.
