7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) is responsible for providing Portland residents with water quality protection, watershed planning, wastewater collection and treatment, sewer installation and stormwater management. BES manages up to 100 construction projects every year, each of which requires project management, budget management, and resource management with an additional 250 projects requiring overall program management. The BES Engineering Services Group currently uses multiple pieces of software along with manual calculations in order to piece together their business processes. Currently, two locally written programs, crucial to payment processing and project and program management, are running on outdated software that can no longer be supported. The current business model is paper-centric, involving duplicate data entry, and encouraging individuals to create unique, manual processes, all of which are highly inefficient and costly.

The need to attain software that will consolidate current business process management for construction and program management into one hosted configurable software environment is significant. The consolidation will eliminate redundant data entry, minimize the use of paper, allow for electronic transmission of data, and improve project quality and the timeliness of project delivery.

On December 27, 2013, Request for Proposal (RFP) No. 116165 for Construction and Program Management Software was issued in accordance with Portland City Code 5.33. On February 6, 2014 eleven (11) proposals were received. The proposals were reviewed, evaluated and scored by a selection committee that included minority evaluator participation.

The proposal from e-Builder, Inc. was deemed responsive to the requirements of the

solicitation and received the highest evaluation score. On June 25, 2014, the City issued a Notice of Intent to Negotiate and Award and no protests were received. e-Builder, Inc. has a current City of Portland business license account, is in full compliance with the Equal Benefits Program, and their EEO Certification is current through August 21, 2014.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The estimated cost for the initial three-year contract is \$735,928.80. Implementation services, license, and first year support will be \$435,579 from the current fiscal year capital project funds. The ongoing maintenance costs for the hosted software will be funded through the BES sewer system operating fund and funds are currently allocated for this contract. The level of confidence in the negotiated cost for these services is Optimal.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:

Authorize a contract with e-Builder for hosted software in an amount not to exceed \$735,928.80 over a three-year contract term.
