

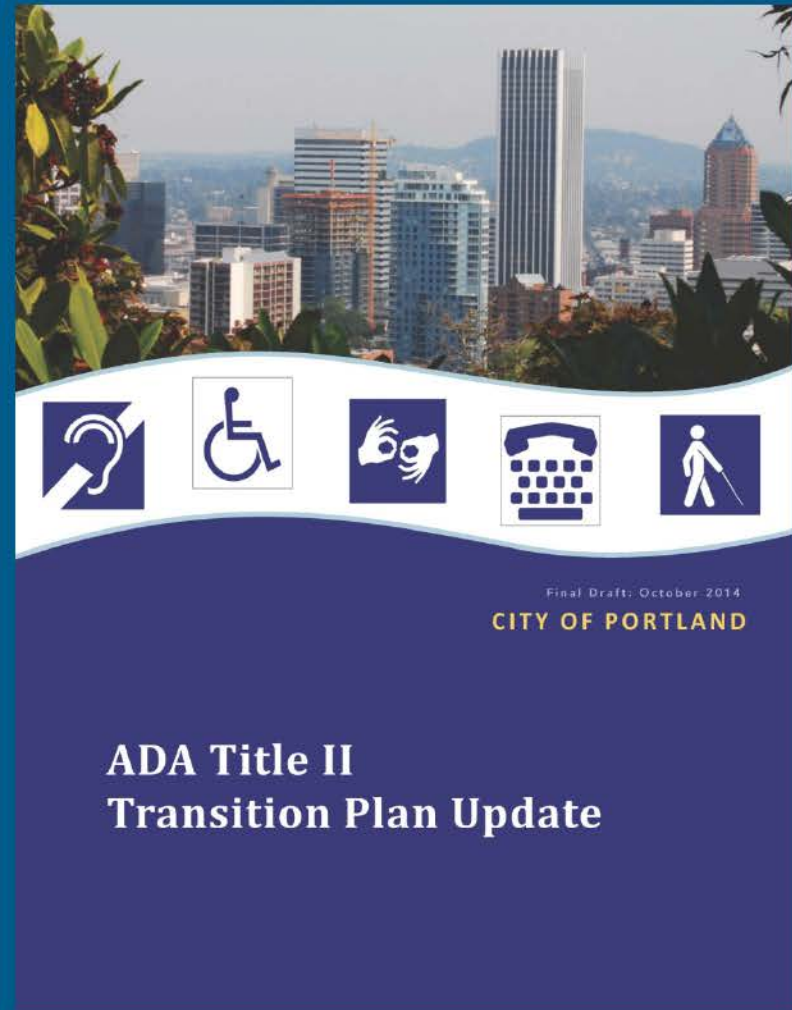

- Provide effective planning tools to track and report accessibility improvements



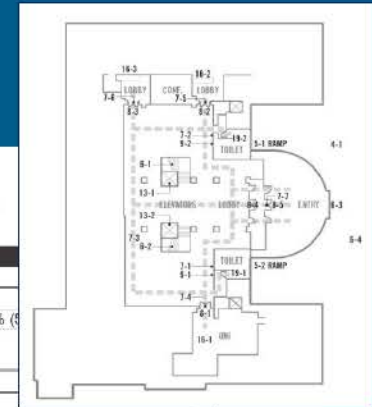
Exceptional Staff Involvement and Public Engagement

Removing Barriers in Facilities

1. Access to the main entrance or path of travel to where programs, activities and services are provided
2. Access to the area where programs are provided
3. Access to amenities
4. Features that are not required to be modified for accessibility

Kenton Firehouse

- Home to ONI programs
- Historic structure with no accessible path of travel to the second floor
- City staff has shifted their programs from the second to the first floor
- Second floor is Staff only



Prioritizing the Transition Plan

- Level of use by the public
- Program uniqueness
- Geographic distribution
- Critical nature of the service provided
- Identified complaints
- City-owned facilities
- Social need / equity





Implementation Plan

Each Bureau is managing an active spreadsheet that monitors and tracks the removal of barriers.

Years 1 – 2: Fiscal years 2014/15 – 2015/16

Years 3 – 5: Fiscal years 2016/17 – 2017/18

Years 6 – 10: Fiscal years 2019/20 – 2023/24

Years 11+: Fiscal years 2024/25 +

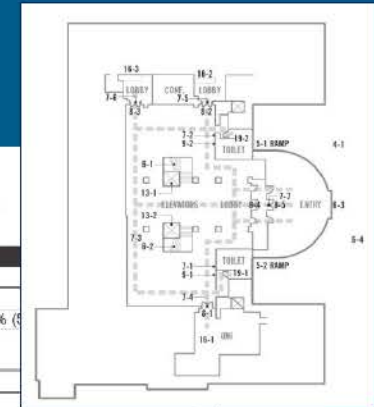
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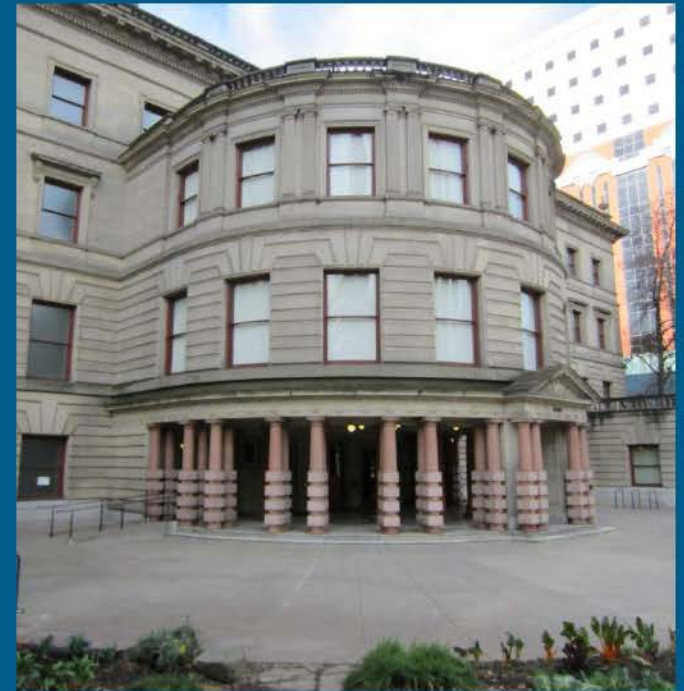
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
