\*Authorize contract with Bio-Med Testing, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$622,075 for drug, alcohol and steroid testing services (Ordinance)

#### 2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The purpose of this legislation is to request authorization to enter into a contract with Bio-Med for drug, alcohol and steroid testing services.

The City requires drug and alcohol testing for all employees in safety-sensitive positions as mandated by the federal DOT. Additionally, non-DOT drug and alcohol testing may be required for City employees when reasonable suspicion of drug or alcohol use exists, and all sworn members of the Portland Police Bureau are required to submit to random drug testing, which includes testing for steroids. The City currently maintains a comprehensive Drug Testing Program in order to minimize the City's financial risk and comply with federal and state regulatory requirements and the Police Bureau requirements through a contract with Bio-Med.

The current contract with Bio-Med will expire on November 14, 2014. Bio-Med submitted a proposal in response to RFP BHR014 to provide these services for the City. The selection committee determined that, of the three organizations that submitted proposals, Bio-Med is the organization that could best meet the City's needs.
