The State of Oregon, Oregon Military Department, Office of Emergency Management (OEM) has notified the City that it will award a subgrant for the FY 2014 State Homeland Security Grant Program to the Police Bureau in the amount of \$136,399. This legislation authorizes the Mayor to accept the grant on behalf of the City. The grant period is October 1, 2014, through September 30, 2015.
