 - a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

Accepting the report would not have significant impacts in the community. However, implementing 311 would have substantial community benefits. 311 is a single easy-to-remember telephone number for the community that provides seamless access to general information and government services, language translation available immediately for non-English speakers, tracking and routing of service requests, and a coordinated response to requests even when they involve multiple bureaus. The 311 software will track where requests are coming from and how quickly and how well the City responds to different types of requests. With this information, the City will be able to set customer service goals, identify locations within the City that are generating many requests, and track data about our response in order to make improvements.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The consultant team held four focus groups at locations in different parts of the City to gather input from the community about 311. The City advertised these focus groups via the City website, social media, and the Office of Neighborhood Involvement's Information & Referral service. In addition, the consultant team met with Multnomah County staff as well as staff from 211 Info, which provides referral to human services in our community. If the City implements 311, additional outreach to the community would be needed to ensure that people in diverse communities know the resource is available.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The consultants incorporated information from the public focus groups as well as their meetings with Multnomah County representatives and 211 Info in their recommendation.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

The consultant team designed and implemented the public involvement.
