I read the 23 page report – my fear is that this expensive budget item will destroy the City and County Referral system: (503) 823-4000 system. To put this in perspective, think about calling your Doctor's office, your message is important to us you are #6 in queue or leave your message and we will return your call. Might add when your Pharmacist calls your Doctor's Office with a Rx concern office -- s/he gets the same message. By ORS the Pharmacist must fill it – as written.

Yes, 311 must be staffed from 5:01 p.m. on Friday to 7:59 a.m. on Monday – accessing the referral system currently housed in City Hall. I don't see a need to rent a 48,000 office space on the Westside when we have a great referral response system located in City Hall.

Why not? I believe this new 311 system would be like taking a chain saw to the best functional City and County referral system. This proposed 311 systems will seriously compromise the work done by the Public Involvement Advisory Council. Their efforts to strengthen partnership between community and government, resulting in the best decisions for all of Portland were a waste of time. My fear? Something to think about, who will benefit most? These consultants and managers hired from outside the Portland system, or we the people who voted you into office?

(Nov. 10, 2014) Portland Mayor Charlie Hales and City Commissioner Steve Novick will brief the news media on a proposed Portland Street Fund. The result of nearly a year of public input, the Portland Street Fund will more than double the City's pavement maintenance budget and make major investments in transportation safety improvements, especially in East Portland.
