7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This Ordinance settles a fleet bodily injury claim for a vehicle vs. pedestrian collision that occurred on the night of November 20, 2013. Mr. Oak, a pedestrian wearing dark clothing, was walking westbound in the crosswalk on SE Cherry Blossom Drive crossing SE 106th, in Portland, Oregon. A Portland Police Officer driving a patrol car was eastbound on Cherry Blossom, turning left onto 106th. He had a green light, and was traveling at a slow speed. The officer did not see the dark-clad pedestrian until he was part way through his turn, and was not able to stop in time to prevent a slow-speed impact.

Mr. Oak was treated for a leg injury and back pain. He retained attorney Todd Peterson to represent him on this claim. After substantial negotiation with the claimant's attorney, the parties have reached a recommended settlement of the claim for the total sum of \$47,500. From this total settlement, the claimant's attorney will satisfy the reimbursement claim from Mr. Oak's insurer, as well as any outstanding medical expenses, so that the \$47,500 payment will be the total payment by the City of Portland for this claim.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$47,500 from the liability fund.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Johnny Oak bodily injury claim in the sum of \$47,500.
