ORDINANCE No. 186889

*Authorize grant agreement with South Waterfront Community Relations for data collection, analysis and research of best parking practices (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The South Waterfront area is a high-density area of new development in the south end of downtown. It is connected to downtown Portland by the Portland Streetcar's NS Line, and to the Oregon Health & Science University campus atop Marquam Hill by the Portland Aerial Tram, as well as roads to Interstate 5 and Oregon Route 43.
- 2. South Waterfront Community Relations' (SWCR) mission is to develop and promote community building activities in Portland's South Waterfront. In addition, SWCR works with residents and employees to encourage alternative transportation options and to promote sustainability at the neighborhood level.
- 3. Access to all of downtown and effective management of on-street parking is important to maintaining a vibrant neighborhood.
- 4. In an on-going effort to manage on street parking with the South Waterfront area, SWCR is conducting research on variable pricing, shared parking and district parking and how these methods of management may be used in the area.
- 5. Data collection and analysis of on-street parking is necessary to determine if current policies adequately support parking management objectives.
- 6. SWCR's research and data collection may help benefit the City as it seeks to update current parking management policies.
- 7. Gathering on-street parking data and mode split information will help inform parking approaches in areas of the City including the South Waterfront.
- 8. Research and reporting key information about district parking, shared parking and variable pricing approaches in leading American cities will inform the City of Portland's discussion about if, and how, to use these parking management approaches within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. That the Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to execute this agreement with South Waterfront Community Relations, in a form similar to the contract attached as Exhibit A.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because failure to collect parking data in a timely manner will impact the analysis of the parking data; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


