Public involvement was crucial over the course of the URA amendment work. The Committee met five times to discuss all six of the potentially affected URAs, reviewing budgets, boundaries, and financial impacts. Staff also hosted a public open house on September 11, 2014, advertising the event though advertisements in the Oregonian, social media, and sending an email blast out to over 3,000 interested parties.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

At the May 7, 2014 meeting, Council advised staff to conduct a robust public involvement campaign. Commissioner Fritz, in particular, was instrumental in providing direction to broaden the public participation and meet with neighborhood associations.
