ORDINANCE No. 186909

* Authorize application to Metro Regional Travel Options for a grant in the amount of \$800,000 for Active Portland: Open Street, Connected Communities (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Metro Regional Travel Options (RTO) grants program provides \$2.1 million for transportation demand management projects. Grant funding is awarded on a competitive basis for projects that increase use of travel options, reduce pollution and improve mobility.
- 2. RTO awards a minimum award of \$50,000 to government agencies and non-profit organizations.
- 3. The Portland Bureau of Transportation is requesting \$800,000 to support transportation demand management programs, such as the Welcome SmartTrips PBOT's award winning individualized marketing program that offers every new and relocating Portland resident the opportunity to order free transportation resources and provides experiential opportunities to walk and bike in a comfortable, supported environment.
- 4. The Transportation System Plan, Climate Action Plan, and Portland Plan call for transportation demand management programs to support walking, bicycling, transit, and carpooling use.
- 5. Active Portland: Open Streets, Connected Communities will build upon 10 years of encouragement and education programs that support active transportation use in Portland and the region.
- 6. RTO grant applications are due December 19, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to make application to Metro Regional Travel Options program for a grant in the amount of \$800,000.
- b. The Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Commissionerin-Charge's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the Metro Regional Travel Options program grant applications are due no later than December 19, 2014; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
