Oregon Impact will reimburse the City a maximum of \$100,000 for sworn personnel overtime hours worked on the 2015 DUII Traffic Safety and High Visibility Enforcement (HVE) program. The reimbursement rate is \$60.00 per hour.

The City will incur personnel expenses over and above the \$60.00 per hour overtime reimbursement rate, which is approximately \$6,051.

\$62.76 Traffic officer OT/hour - \$60/hour reimbursement rate = \$2.76/hour remaining 1667 OT hours x \$2.76 = \$4,601 in OT not reimbursed by the grant $$100,000 \times 0.0145$ FICA = \$1,450 The TriMet payroll tax is not an allowable grant or match expense (\$591.76)

Local match may include any agency resources used to support the overtime activity, including scheduling and report compilation, as well as straight-time enforcement. Local match will be provided from City funds in the form of Regular Salary (g/l account 511100) expenses in support of DUII enforcement in the Police Bureau's FY 2014-15 and FY 2015-16 budgets.

Using a 2:1 ratio, the match will be approximately:

\$100,000/\$60 per hour = 1667 OT hours 1667 OT hours x 2 = 3,334 straight time hours 3,334 ST hours x \$39.28 Traffic officer ST/hour = \$130,959.50 in straight time dollars
