ORDINANCE No. 186935

Amend an Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County to decrease funding by \$136,955 for transitional housing for chronic offenders identified by the Service Coordination Team (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 320004147)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The chronic recurrence of crime diminishes neighborhood livability and negatively impacts the community's perception of safety.
- 2. There is a causal relationship between substance abuse and the commission of crime.
- 3. When treatment programs are more available for those offenders with the greatest need for and potential to benefit from treatment, crime decreases.
- 4. Multnomah County manages a contract with Volunteers of America to provide these treatment services.
- 5. Supportive housing for this treatment will be moved to a different facility and managed by a different contractor. Multnomah County will now contract VOA for treatment services only.
- 6. The City wishes to amend the contract to decrease funding by \$136,955. The new not to exceed amount on the contract will be \$609,045.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement substantially in accordance with the amendment attached as Exhibit A.
