ORDINANCE NO. 186940

Authorize as surplus the City-owned Sandy River Conduit 2/4 Bridge and authorize the Water Bureau to proceed with the sale, donation or recycling of the property (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Sandy River Conduit Relocation Project required that Conduits 2 and 4 be relocated beneath the river and the Sandy River Conduit 2/4 Bridge be removed and placed into storage or relocated.
- 2. As part of the environmental permits necessary for this project, the Water Bureau negotiated a Memorandum of Agreement with the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). This Agreement required the Water Bureau to store the Sandy River Conduit 2/4 Bridge for a period of three years after completion of the Sandy River Conduit Relocation Project. The Agreement also required that during the ensuing three years the Water Bureau was to actively pursue a new owner for the bridge.
- 3. The Water Bureau has undertaken significant local and national outreach to many jurisdictions and private companies in an effort to find a new owner for the bridge. The obligation to store the bridge ended September 2013.
- 4. On June 26, 2014, SHPO informed the Water Bureau that the requirements of the Agreement had been fulfilled and all responsibilities under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Office were complete.
- 5. With the SHPO requirements complete, the Water Bureau will work to dispose of the bridge. It has an estimated salvage value of \$11,600. The bridge has been declared surplus by Commissioner Fish in a memorandum dated September 18, 2014.
- 6. Portland City Code 5.36, Disposition of Surplus Property, authorizes the City to dispose of surplus property by donation to organizations certified under the Internal Revenue Service Code 501(c)(3) or as unusable surplus property via recycling.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. That the Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to execute an agreement for sale, donation, or recycling of the above noted bridge.

b. Any net proceeds from recycling the bridge shall be deposited as revenue to the Water Fund and shall be used to reduce future water rates.


