**Subject:** Concern about an LPG terminal on the Columbia

Dear Ms. Anderson,

I'm very concerned to hear that we are considering invalidating some of our environmental regulations to allow Pembina to build an LPG terminal. Doing this would seem to be a short-term win only with many long-term negative repercussions such as:

- encouraging more fracking, which we know causes terrible water pollution and health problems where it happens as well as more carbon pollution everywhere it is burned
- More train traffic on a system that is already a bit crowded—potential for delays to other freight and passenger service as well as the dangers of derailment and the subsequent cleanup issues
- The danger of possible leaks or explosions at the terminal itself near a highly sensitive area (West Hayden Island and the Columbia itself)

Please keep our regulations in place and recommend denial of the code change.
