Subject: NO exporting of LNG or LPG from Oregon

Dear Ms. Anderson,

I am a citizen and resident of Oregon and I am absolutely 100% opposed to allowing Pembina or anyone else to export millions of barrels per year of LNG or LPG from Oregon.

The Pembina proposed propane export terminal would result in over 10,000 tons of CO₂ released into the atmosphere each day. JUST from the burning of propane. It doesn't include the massive footprint involved in the fracking, liquefying or shipping process. The carbon from these emissions will not stay within the borders of the region where the propane is burned. It will affect the climate and carbon emissions around the globe.

Pembina plans to bring in approximately 36,000 barrels/day. The company has indicated a desire to more than double their capacity to permit storage of over 600,000 barrels (up to 30 million gallons) of LPG of pressurized propane at -40 degrees Fahrenheit at their proposed location, adjacent to Pier 6 and immediately across the Hayden Island Channel from West Hayden Island. Large propane tanks create a risk of explosion that could seriously affect this critical natural area, and any explosion control and cleanup would have seriously negative impacts on the Columbia River.

That means one unit train per day (round trip), clogging rail lines and competing with our agriculture and passenger rail. Multiple LPG train derailments and explosions in 2013 and 2014 clearly show the threat that LPG trains can pose to communities and the environment.

And for all of this to happen they need an environmental code amendment from the City of Portland. In other words, permission to ignore our environmental laws or exceed the maximum allowable pollution. Why? WHY should WE allow them to pollute OUR environment for THEIR profit? STOP selling us out to the greedy rich.
