Regarding January 13th hearing on Terminal 6 Environment Overlay Zone Boundary and Code Amendment

I am opposed to the consideration of zoning amendments to accommodate the proposed Propane Terminal near Terminal 6. I own a floating home in the Class Harbor Moorage. This moorage consists of 24 floating homes. We are located at 3939 N. Marine Drive. We are situated between Terminal 6 and the Railroad bridge. Our whole moorage, plus another moorage next to us, would live within 1000 feet of this project! This residential moorage has been approved and has been in existence for decades. This would be an enormous hazard to our moorage.

There have recently been serious accidents with fuel transportation and storage with oil trains. This proposal would add another severe environmental danger.

The city of Portland prides itself on being a "green" city focused on doing what is good for our environment and sustainability. It would be hypocritical to install such a huge fossil fuel storage facility and at the same time say as a city we are reducing our carbon footprint.

I oppose amendments that would facilitate the building of this propane terminal.
