Subject: Portland LPG terminal

I'd like to come to the hearing but have a lot on my plate at work next week Tuesday. Can you try to have a hearing after work hours so that people who work can still attend? If I had heard about this earlier I would have been able to work it into my schedule but it's not possible right now.

As someone who drives over Hayden island and knows people who live there, I have a huge concern about the LPG terminal that is proposed there. There are two issues that come to mind, Safety and riparian impacts.

I wish I could make it to your hearing to learn more about this, because I like to make my own decisions on whether to support things after learning more about them. But without having too much research or heard much about this, I want to just urge you to think with a conservation ethic in mind when you are considering this proposal. Is it something that will help reduce or increase the impacts that Portland will face with climate change (as in will it be something that will reduce or release more CO emissions).

Is this something that you personally would not have a problem living next to, or driving or boating near, if there was ever a gas release or other type of accident?

What will the impact be if there is a spill, and can we plan for a future break or spill on the Columbia now to make it safe, or is there no way to make it safe to the people of Portland and the Columbia river users and traffic?

How is the gas getting to Portland? is there safety or environmental concerns there?

I guess I have the basic NEPA/SEPA concerns, so I would like to see these questions addressed in the EA or EIS that is prepared when you try to make this decision.

Please keep me informed, and consider this email my testimony.
