

# ORDINANCE No. 187003

Extend contract with Madison Biosolids, Inc. for Biosolids Use Services for an additional five years for \$3,250,000 (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 31000149)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) serves the Portland community by protecting public health, water quality, and the environment. The Bureau's Wastewater Group operates and maintains wastewater and stormwater collection and treatment facilities, and ensures compliance with all applicable permits, regulations, and contracts. BES operates and maintains sanitary sewer and stormwater collection and treatment systems in a service area which covers approximately 92,000 acres.

Since 1990 the Columbia Boulevard Wastewater Treatment Plant (CBWTP) has recycled biosolids through land application on agricultural land as a soil additive and fertilizer for a variety of dryland and irrigated crops. Biosolids are the nutrient-rich by-product of municipal wastewater treatment and the City treats raw sewage solids to meet stringent U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) standards before they can be used beneficially.

2. In an effort to strengthen, enhance, and diversify the City's biosolids management program, contract #31000149 - Biosolids Use Services was competitively solicited and awarded as a result of RFP #109947. City Council approved contract #31000149 with Madison Biosolids, Inc., for land application of City biosolids, via Ordinance #182828, May 27, 2009, which allowed an initial five (5) year term with the option to add an additional five (5) year term.

3. During the past few years, Amendment #1 - 4 increased the per wet ton cost of the biosolids in accordance with the CPI. For the past four years, contract # 31000149 has resulted in significant cost savings (approximately \$280,000/yr), reductions in diesel fuel consumption, and support to local Oregon farmers.

4. The contract requires an amendment to execute the final five years of the existing contract. The contract will be amended to increase the contract amount by \$3,250,000 and extend the contract for an additional five (5) year period through March 31, 2020. The total not to exceed amount of the contract will be \$6,365,550.05, including the additional five (5) years.

5. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY2015 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Center ESWW000007, WBS Element, Internal Order

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to amend contract #31000149 with Madison Biosolids, Inc., for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of \$3,250,000 for an additional five (5) years for a total contractual not-to-exceed amount of \$6,365,550.05.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.


