Amending Policy 9.6: Transportation hierarchy for people movement.

Following several meetings between Planning staff, modal coordinators and the chairs of Portland's three modal committees, we recognize the following:

- The modal committees seem in general agreement that Policy 9.6 has many good elements in that its focus is on the movement of people and goods movement is separately considered.
- The policy most closely resembles Vancouver, B.C's approach to prioritization of personal transportation, which is seen as a good model for Portland.
- A principal sticking point with the policy as written seems to be the use of the word "hierarchy," which connotes winners and users.

In a meeting of the above group the week of December 8th, staff advanced the below modified language for Policy 9.6. It is offered here in this draft for further review and comment.

Policy 9.6 Transportation hierarchy checklist strategy for people movement. Implement a hierarchy-prioritization of modes for people movement by making transportation system decisions according to the following prioritization<u>ordered list</u>:

- 1. Walking
- 2. Cycling
- 3. Transit
- 4. Taxi/Commercial Transit/Shared Vehicles
- 5. Zero emission vehicles
- 6. Other private vehicles

When implementing the hierarchythis prioritization, ensure:

- The needs and safety of each group of road users are considered, and changes do not make existing conditions worse for the most vulnerable users higher on the hierarchyordered list.
- All users' needs are balanced with the intent of optimizing the right of way for multiple modes on the same street, and
- <u>wW</u>hen necessary to ensure safety, accommodate some users on parallel streets as part of a multi-street corridors.
- Land use and system plans, network functionality for all modes, other street functions, and complete street policies, is maintained.
- Rationale is provided if modes lower in the hierarchy-ordered list are prioritized.

Above language includes an additional bullet point at suggestion of planning staff following the meeting with modal chairs and staff ("...balanced with the intent of optimizing...").
