**Subject:** Regarding Pembina Pipeline's propane export terminal

Hello all,

I would like to voice my concern and raise opposition against the proposed Pembina Pipeline. My family and I are residents of St. Johns, Portland, Oregon and I am the former secretary of the St. Johns Neighborhood Association. I have been following the information regarding this proposed terminal, including a presentation to our neighborhood by Pembina, and I am absolutely opposed to the idea.

A few, brief, points:

This would be an amendment to our existing codes, which were put in place for a reason. Propane is not an environmentally friendly fuel source, and does not align with our climate change action plan.

While Pembina has been consistent in assuring our health & safety, obviously, they are invested in their profit. Meanwhile, there would be a large hazard zone and North Portland already has more than its fair share of environmental damage, industrial by-products, air quality issues, and more.

The fact that Pembina was offered to "invest" in the community & in Portland feels like a bribe and that alone raises red-flags and cause for concern.

I strongly urge you to think of the long term, big picture and to deny any accommodations for, or approval of Pembina's propane export.
