I am writing to ask you to say NO to the proposed Pembina terminal: It is at odds with Portland's Climate Action Plan, it's a huge potential hazard (an accident waiting to happen in a region waiting for a severe earthquake we are already woefully underprepared for) and this latter concern isn't adequately acknowledged, let alone addressed in Pembina's application.
