## ORDINANCE No. 187069

\* Apply to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance for a grant in the amount of \$200,000 for the Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Program FY 2015 Solicitation to expand the capacity of the Portland Police Bureau Behavioral Health Unit (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) is seeking applications for funding for the Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Program to further the Department's mission by increasing public safety through innovative cross-system collaboration for individuals with mental illness who come into contact with the criminal justice system.
- 2. The Police Bureau wishes to apply for this grant in collaboration with Central City Concern in order to expand the capacity of the Behavioral Health Unit to address the needs of individuals who may currently be beyond the scope of services provided through the existing program.
- 3. The grant award will be made over two fiscal years, each providing \$100,000. BJA may elect to make awards for applications submitted under this solicitation in future fiscal years, depending on the merit of the applications and on the availability of appropriations.
- 4. This award requires a 20% match of total program costs.
- 5. Funding for the \$50,000 match will come from existing Police Bureau appropriations.

## NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance for a grant in the amount of \$200,000.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because of critical deadlines in the grant application process. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
