Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The Portland Watershed Report Cards were developed to address an element of the Portland Watershed Management Plan work plan which required the preparation of a simple, clear way to communicate the health of Portland's watersheds.

We expect that the Report Cards for each of Portland's watersheds will better inform Portlanders, policy makers, and Commissioners why investments in watershed health are important, and how to select the best, most cost effective actions to achieve our goals.

Financial and budgetary impacts: Not applicable.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Since 2010, when Report Card development began, BES has engaged representatives of most sectors of the community to promote discussion of, and receive feedback on, the relevance and value of an index system (the underpinning of the Report Card) to best communicate the health of our watersheds and allow evaluation of city work to promote watershed health. Our current Report Cards represent four years of data and is what we are using to establish a baseline of watershed health. Now that we have watershed health grades available, we are continuing to engage in discussions with a wide range of stakeholders to determine how we can improve the utility of this tool. No significant objections to this work have been received, however continued, valuable feedback will allow us to enhance the applicability and function of the Report Card tool.
