## ORDINANCE No. 187115

\*Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County to establish a medical resource request system for regionally organized health care systems (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. This Agreement is intended to establish an agreement that addresses the issue of medical resource requests only. Both the City of Portland (CITY) and Multnomah County (COUNTY) understand that health care systems will request non-medical resources directly from the City of Portland's Emergency Coordination Center (ECC).
- 2. The City of Portland has established an emergency management agency as described in ORS 401.305(2). The Portland Emergency Coordination Center (CITY ECC) is the centralized location that coordinates a multiagency response to an emergency event within the City of Portland. CITY ECC supports the on-scene response by facilitating emergency declarations, mobilizing resources, requesting assistance from county, state and federal agencies, disseminating emergency public information, organizing and implementing large-scale evacuations, coordinating shelter and mass care for evacuees, and providing decision-making support to elected officials.
- 3. Multnomah County has established an emergency management agency as required by ORS 401.305(2). In the event of a significant emergency or disaster, Multnomah County intends to activate its Emergency Coordination Center (COUNTY ECC) to provide support and coordination for responding agencies and other entities. The COUNTY ECC further intends to develop and share situation status reports on a regular basis. If mutual aid partners cannot provide needed resources, the COUNTY ECC is the State-mandated point through which requests for resources are submitted to the State. If local resources are not adequate to respond to an emergency, the COUNTY may seek an emergency declaration by the Governor.
- 4. Regionally organized multi-hospital/clinic health care systems have indicated that they utilize centralized medical resource procurement processes that serve their various hospital and clinic service sites. These systems may seek medical resources from the government sector in situations when they cannot procure such resources through intra-system support, medical supply vendors or health care system mutual aid.
- 5. Under most conditions, regionally organized health care systems are able to obtain the necessary medical resources to provide health care services. However, in certain incidents, regionally organized health care systems may not be able to obtain the necessary medical resources from their vendor suppliers, health care system partners and/or regional health care partners. If health care systems cannot obtain medical resources using these methods, they may seek medical resources from government agencies. The COUNTY ECC is the Statemandated point through which requests for resources are submitted.

## NOW THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to approve, by signature, the IGA to establish the system for health care medical resource requests.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists due to the uncertainty surrounding catastrophic events, therefore, a delay could prevent regionally organized multi-hospital/clinic health care systems from procuring life-saving resources. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by council.
