Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The purpose of the legislation is to authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Oregon State Police.

The mission of the HIDTA Initiative is the interdiction of illegal drugs and drug proceeds being transported to, from, and through the Oregon HIDTA Region. The goal is to reduce drug availability by coordinating federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies by targeting drug trafficking and drug trafficking proceeds.

The Police Bureau Drugs and Vice Division's investigative efforts identify and disrupt or dismantle drug trafficking organizations operating in or from neighborhoods in all parts of the city of Portland. The grant authorizes the city to reimburse the Oregon State Police (OSP) Criminal Investigation Division (CID) for their work on HIDTA cases.

The Portland Police Bureau is the fiduciary lead for the taskforce and the initiative is managed by Portland Police Bureau and the Oregon State Police.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

There are no financial or budgetary impacts with this legislation. The Oregon Department of Justice (ODOJ) HIDTA program will reimburse the City for the \$150,000 passed through to OSP.

Community impacts and community involvement:

There is no voluntary citizen participation. There are no links to current City policies.

Geographic area, neighborhoods: OSP Troopers will be assigned to PPB DVD, and the Roseburg and Bend OSP Offices. HIDTA is a state-wide initiative.

Businesses (small, large, specific types); institutions; interest-based organizations: HIDTA grants enable the Police Bureau and OSP to work with commercial transportation and shipping businesses to detect and prevent illegal drug trafficking activities that are occurring within the business concern.

City livability (contributes to a prosperous, educated, healthy, equitable Portland):

Grant funding enables the Police Bureau and OSP to identify, dismantle and disrupt drug trafficking organizations operating within or from the city of Portland and parts of Oregon, and to limit the supply of illegal and highly harmful drugs that otherwise would be available. The grant assists the Police Bureau and OSP in the improvement of livability through the reduction of organized criminal activity and the provision of harm reduction through the limitation of the illegal drug supply.

Summarize significant objections/concerns and support/agreement: There are no legitimate objections or concerns related to receiving grant funding that allows the Police Bureau and OSP to limit the supply of illegal drugs being shipped to or through the city of Portland through police interdictions efforts, and the Police Bureau has historically received extensive public support for drug investigative and enforcement work that ultimately serves to improve city livability.
